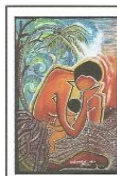

2. Dear Friends

Although we find ourselves in another lockdown, we can look ahead with some optimism as there is light at the end of the tunnel. That said, it is going to be a lengthy tunnel and a hard road. January and February can always be a long and dark month, only made worse this year with all of the COVID restrictions. It has however been great to hear that so many of you have now had a first vaccine. We can therefore look ahead with some hope and we should look ahead, which is why our telephone and Facebook Live services in January started a process by asking this question:-

Can Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians help us begin to think about how to be Church in a post Covid world?

If you managed to join the services then I hope that you agree with me, that the answer to this question is yes. Our context is very different to 1st Century Thessalonica, but there are rich words from Paul in this letter that I think we need to hear and absorb. Most importantly, that our starting place for this process of looking ahead should be from one of grace and peace.

Paul is separated from the Thessalonian Christians and although he has tried, he has been unable to get back to see them. This letter is in response to a positive report from Timothy who has managed to get back to the community. Paul himself identifies his intense longing to be together again with the Thessalonian Christians, a feeling that Timothy reveals is mutual.

There is much we are longing for and I am sure a huge part of this is being with others in Saughtonhall. We long to be together to worship, to meet, to chat, to eat, to watch films, to see a Drama production; it is a long list. Perhaps Church Meetings are not top of that list, but these form an extremely important part of our tradition in the United Reformed Church. I, with the Elders, am very aware that it has been some time since our last Church Meeting. Although we could hold one using the Zoom platform, the Elders have considered that on balance we should hold off meantime and wait until we can do so face to face. This is an acceptable position to take given the current circumstances. You should be reassured that the Elders continue to meet regularly using Zoom. I am grateful for their commitment and support during these challenging times for us all. Please remember that if you have any concerns or questions about where we are and what are doing, you should not hesitate to contact myself or your Elder.
