Dear Friends

As we embrace the season of Advent 2022 I wonder how you are feeling? This is not a rhetorical question so take a moment to pause, breathe and think before you read on.....

I suspect much that has come to mind has brought feelings of concern and anxiety; perhaps even a sense of fear and loss, which are feelings shared with many around us in what the world we know has become. In embracing all the season of Advent brings, a welcome tonic can be uncovered. However to find this, we have to have an understanding of what Advent is actually all about.

In the Church calendar the seasons of Advent and Lent have many parallels, and yet the associated holiness of Lent can often feel diluted or even extinguished by the external cultural pressures of the season during Advent. Pressures that I am fairly certain have not helped form your response to my opening question.

Advent is not about counting down to Christmas with a check list of things to buy, places to go, people to see and arrangements to confirm. Advent is the beginning of a new year in the Church calendar that carries themes of hope, peace, joy and love. A season of intentional expectant waiting and anticipation not just to celebrate the Nativity of Christ, but also in preparation for the day of promised return, whenever that may be and in whatever form that may take.

Perhaps the feelings you are carrying have been triggered by a lament for the past and how things used to be? When life seemed more straightforward and what Advent should be was an imbedded part of our culture alongside the Church, rather than what it has all become?

In 2022 highlighting what the season of Advent should be about is really counter cultural and sadly for many it will therefore be new information. However, I am not sure this is as bad as it may appear because everything about the embodied person of God in Jesus, whose birth we will soon celebrate, together with his ministry and the movement he established, was counter cultural.

What Jesus brought and offered was an alternative that challenged the religious and political thinking of the day. It wasn't easy for those who bought in to it and signed up, but it was the hope, peace, joy and love they found that inspired, energised and fueled their passion and commitment to the light of Christ in complex and challenging times.

As we embrace the season of Advent 2022, look to the light of Christ and be open to the counter culture rhythm of this season that we claim. A beat that can be found in the hope, peace, joy and love of Christ. A much needed, welcome and in many ways, counter cultural tonic.

Take a moment to pause, breathe and think about this....

As we embrace the season of Advent 2022 I wonder how you are feeling?

'Cock O' The North'. This was the third time that play had been performed at Saughtonhall (previously in 1981 and 2004) but, despite that, it was well received and was given a glowing 4* review.

The latest fundraising / social event of the year was a Beetle Drive, a fun-filled evening at the end of September, which raised £288.05p. That rounded off the fundraising events and brought the grand total up to £1335.90p

An 'Open Night' is being held on *Thursday, 19th January* when it is proposed to display a selection of documents, photos, etc. from previous productions, meet and introduce potential new members to the group and give them the opportunity to read from a range of plays and possibly audition for parts.

The dates for next year's Spring production are Wednesday 19th – Saturday 22nd April (*afternoon performance only on the Saturday*).

The Play Selection Committee have yet to select a suitable play (so watch this space!)

Details of the Summer production have also to be confirmed. At the group's Annual General Meeting in October it was proposed, and agreed, to donate £1,500 to the church.

Faith Action for Nature is one resource online that you can access using the link https://faithactionfornature.org on which you will find seasonal packs including worship resources, family activities and practical actions for caring for nature.

As the year turns, the leaves change and the days lengthen, it's time to dip into the Autumn pack for inspiration. The theme for this season is Shelter, with reflections on the various images of God as our refuge. Do some shelter-building in the woods, install homes for wildlife, and think about the birds and animals that take shelter around your home and your church.

The theme for the winter season pack is Feast, not just because winter is dominated by the feast of Christmas, but because it's a good time to reflect on abundance, scarcity, and provision. For many animals and birds it's a tough time of year and the pack has a variety of practical activities to help.

Here's the latest news from Ryan Strachan, Goods and Services Manager.

I would like to announce a brand-new service that started just last week I will use an excellent description provided by Biddy

"NESSie – North Edinburgh Support Services is a new innovative service that is a consortium between Fresh Start, Move On, North Edinburgh Arts and Spartans Community Football Academy. We have each recruited a Development Support Work (Fresh Start's is Craig Anderson so if you see him, please say hello!) and the team of 4 will work as a distinct team. They will support people in need – with a no wrong door and no criteria approach.

They will provide short- and long-term support based on the person's needs and wishes. And they will develop bespoke pathways to access a wide range of services and supports that will assist in helping people "thrive not survive".

This is a new approach to helping prevent people living in poverty not re-enter the homelessness system and will allow access to all of Fresh Start's services."

For me this is really exciting as having that level of knowledge and remit is so helpful, I come into direct contact with clients via our white goods service, being able bring in the Nessie team and get immediate help rather than signposting to another agency is going to be amazing.

That brings me neatly on to our Cookers for Christmas appeal, I have only been with Fresh Start for 6 months but being able to provide white goods for those in need and genuinely change their lives is the single most rewarding thing I have done in my time here. Abi has sent me her update regarding the Hub and its good work, it's a such a lovely space and I had the pleasure of working one of the Wednesday Meet and Eat events just last week.

"Pantry continues to support members of the local community with low cost food, currently 231 members – donations of food always welcome!

Shop – Christmas pop up shop on 28th November – 2nd December 9am-12.30pm for all things Christmassy

Hub - English classes with run for absolute beginners for 12 weeks starting December $\mathbf{1}^{st}$, places limited to 10, but we expect there will be a waiting list as these will be popular

Digital drop in with People Know How, very popular at the moment – access to help with devices including job applications, paying bills online and bidding for houses

Community Meet and Eats —which started in July with a turnout of 5 just peaked on Friday at 60 lunches (40 sit down, 20 take away) with food cooked and served by supported volunteers who have completed our cooking classes, now running on Wednesday evenings in response to cost of living and energy crisis — hot food, warm welcome and safe place to be

Gardens – cooling down for the winter months, with plans to run a Tool sharing shed in the new year".

The final service update is from Denise who runs our very successful pantry

"I am going to run a little loyalty scheme leading up to Christmas in the pantry, when our members shop week beginning 5/12 - 12/12 and 19/12 and have their loyalty card stamped x3 times they can choose a free heart and a free diamond item, they will also get a little Christmas gift of either a selection box or a box of biscuits. I received a £200 donation (cheque in donations box) from a friend to buy selection boxes and/or biscuits but any donations would be great
